The curriculum design by the affiliated university and taught the same to the students. The institution has three departments B.A., B.Com and B.Sc. The current student strength is 1143 and there are 23 teaching staff which includes permanent staff with 16 supporting staff. CBCS is in practice with continuous internal assessment system, To inculcate the spirit of sports, social service, patriotism and discipline, the institution has NSS two units. Experiential learning, participative learning and group discussion are being used to improve the quality of learning process. As per the norms of affiliated university the examination and evaluation work are being implemented. CIE system like assignments, class tests, online tests, oral exam are conducted. It is transparent and systematic through grievances related to university examinations and by handing over the answer scripts to the students after assessment of unit tests as well as terminal examinations. It is the need of the hour that teaching staff be encouraged to do research publications in their respective field. Programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes should be discussed effectively among the faculty members and the same may be disseminated to the students and it should be displayed in the college website. Among the teaching staff there are 22 Ph.D. Degree holders and only one of them has only Post graduate degree. They may go for appointing rest vacant sanctioned posts by qualified teachers.

Through NSS unit of the institution organises many programmes like tree plantation, creating awareness about the environmental sustainability, programmes to eradicate social evils, organising blood donation camp, and the programmes to have clean village, however it can be appreciated that if the institution make them transparent to the respective stakeholders.

The college organizes programmes to promote women's health and hygiene, personality development and yoga training programmes. The college may go for conducting national, international conferences, seminars, workshops, symposiums through various departments. The College may introduce add on value based certificate courses and also subject based certificate courses in all the departments. The placement cell, Career Counselling cell and a registered alumni association in the college may be formed and should be proactive.

College ground should be maintained suitably for games and sports. College library has required books collection specially the text books subject relevant the current edition of the books be purchased like taxation, law etc. The hard copy of the journals latest editions shall be subscribed so that the students are aware about recent changes.

Book collections, especially, textbooks, reference books, relevant journals to the existing academic programmes may be improved. On the Campus and off the campus open access to the library may be introduced. Daily library uses with faculty and students may be improved. The college has LIBMAN software purchased from Mastersoft (ERP software) Nagpur. The library automation may be introduced. It may be appreciated that if the library procures more number of books for all the disciplines and make the library operational activities transparent. Separate hostel facilities for boys and girls may be provided. Campus security may be ensured by deploying adequate security personnel in addition to the existing CCTV surveillance.
